

2007 OCER Sponsored Breed Awards

The following awards require registration papers.

Arabian: All horses in this category must have a copy of registration papers on file with OCER. If the OCER members name is not listed on the registration papers as the owner then the member(s) must be able to provide proof of ownership for the horse if the ownership is ever challenged by a fellow member (ex. bill of sale). The following registry is considered acceptable for this award. THE ARABIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION or any of its predecessors.

Half Arabian/Anglo Arabian: All horses in this category must have a copy of registration papers on file with OCER. If the OCER members name is not listed on the registration papers as the owner then the member(s) must be able to provide proof of ownership for the horse if the ownership is ever challenged by a fellow member (ex. bill of sale). The following registry is considered acceptable for this award. THE ARABIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION HALF ARABIAN/ANGLO ARABIAN REGISTRY or any of its predecessors.

Morab: All horses in this category must have a copy of registration papers on file with OCER. If the OCER members name is not listed on the registration papers as the owner then the member(s) must be able to provide proof of ownership for the horse if the ownership is ever challenged by a fellow member (ex. bill of sale). The following registry is considered acceptable for this award. THE INTERNATIONAL MORAB REGISTRY or any of its predecessors.

Saddlebred: All horses in this category must have a copy of registration papers on file with OCER. If the OCER members name is not listed on the registration papers as the owner then the member(s) must be able to provide proof of ownership for the horse if the ownership is ever challenged by a fellow member (ex. bill of sale). The following registry is considered acceptable for this award. THE AMERICAN SADDLEBRED HORSE ASSOCIATION or any of its predecessors.

Quarter Horse: All horses in this category must have a copy of registration papers on file with OCER. If the OCER members name is not listed on the registration papers as the owner then the member(s) must be able to provide proof of ownership for the horse if the ownership is ever challenged by a fellow member (ex. bill of sale). The following registry is considered acceptable for this award. THE AMERICAN QUARTER HORSE ASSOCIATION or any of its predecessors.

Spanish Mustang: All horses in this category must have a copy of registration papers on file with OCER. If the OCER members name is not listed on the registration papers as the owner then the member(s) must be able to provide proof of ownership for the horse if the ownership is ever challenged by a fellow member (ex. bill of sale). The following registries are considered acceptable for this award. THE SOUTHWEST SPANISH MUSTANG ASSOCIATION, SPANISH MUSTANG REGISTRY, or any of their predecessors.

The following awards do not require registration papers.

Appaloosa: All horses in this category must have some type of proof of pure breeding even though they are not registered (ex. papers of registered parents, pedigree of horse). This means you are accepting horses that have not been blood typed or DNA tested to verify positive identification. Other examples of this could be owners that never registered offspring but have all the required paperwork (ex. rushcreek geldings). So you might have proven registered horses in this category and assumed purebred horses but not 100% verified.

Thoroughbred: All horses in this category must have some type of proof of pure breeding even though they are not registered (ex. papers of registered parents, pedigree of horse). This means you are accepting horses that have not been blood typed or DNA tested to verify positive identification. Other examples of this could be owners that never registered offspring but have all the required paperwork (ex. rushcreek geldings). So you might have proven registered horses in this category and assumed purebred horses but not 100% verified.

Zane's Grey Dandy Gaited Horse Award: Not required to be registered. Principle gait should be something other than a trot or canter. The horse may trot or canter as long as the horse prefers to gait (ex. single foot, pace, running walk, fox trot, or fino).

Mule: Any equine with long ears and looks like a mule.

The Heinz 57 Grade Horse Award: For horses with mixed or unknown heritage.

Non-Registered Arabian Type Horse Award: Any Arabian type horse with a known pedigree that is not registered. The horse is not required to be 100% Arabian.
